If you have seen some new initials floating around over the last two years, could I suggest that you sit up and take notice. QFE is the acronym for the **Queensland Forum of Ex-Service Organisations.** QFE arose from the Kindred Organisations Committee of the RSL.

The RSL, and in particular, Queensland Deputy President of the day, Kel Ryan, provided strong support to the forum. However, it was soon realised that to demonstrate its independence from any particular ex-service organisation [ESO], the new forum had to stand alone.

This was agreed by all parties and in 2008, the QFE was formed with Kel Ryan as its inaugural Chairman. Kel continues in this position.

QFE sets out to identify the issues of greatest importance to its member organisations and to use its broad representation to take these issues to Government by the most appropriate means. QFE is a refreshing organisation with a pleasing culture of respect for one another's beliefs and values and a readiness to listen to the other person's point of view.

EMAIL and the INTERNET

Protect your privacy: protect your e-mail

Despite the rise of social networks and Twitter, email is still the way many of us communicate. But it can put a tremendous amount of your private data at risk. Here are some tips for minimising that risk.

Bad guys have a number of ways to compromise your account including

- brute force attacks (trying username/password combinations until they stumble on the right one),
- password resets, or
- intercepting login credentials sent in the clear.

The risk: If you're like most people, your email account contains old bank statements (or links to same), addresses, information about other accounts, maybe even credit card numbers or passwords: it's a treasure trove for an identity thief. If an attacker gains control of your email account, he can reset the passwords of other accounts. Finally, an attacker can harvest your friends' emails for spam or phishing attacks.

NEW ATO SCAM

The Tax Commissioner has warned the community to be aware of a particularly nasty fake email claiming to offer refunds from the ATO. The new type of scam pretending to be from the ATO contains a virus which is an attachment to the message.

Any email requesting personal and credit or debit card details before a tax refund can be released is a hoax.

Other scams reported to the ATO involve people being asked to provide financial or personal details via phone, email or face-to-face. The ATO advises us to always use ATO online services by visiting www.ato.gov.au.

The ATO urges the public to be diligent and alert to this and other scam behaviour.



ALLIANCE OF DEFENCE SERVICE ORGANISATIONS

AN IMPORTANT MESSAGE TO ALL DFWA MEMBERS – 30 JUNE 2011

Members will be aware of our longstanding campaign to provide fair indexation to military superannuants. Recent events were not able to be included in this edition of *Camaraderie* and this note provides you with the latest information.

- The Fair Indexation Bill, introduced by the Opposition, was debated in the Senate on 16 June and was defeated. The vote was 34-34 and was lost by the negative votes of the Greens, Senator Xenophon and the Labor Senators.
- Earlier, the House of Representatives passed a motion of support (introduced by the Opposition), for both the Bill and for Fair Indexation for military superannuants (as well as the concept of the Unique Nature of Military Service).

The Opposition will now defer further action on this matter, having had its Bill defeated. They have assured us (and we will continue to remind them) that Fair Indexation will see its light of day if it wins Government at the next election.

The Greens have previously indicated support for the concept of Fair Indexation but chose to vote against the Bill on 16 June. In the new Senate the Greens will hold the balance of power. We will continue our direct lobbying on your behalf. Senator Xenophon, whilst supporting Fair Indexation, was spooked by the costs and asked the Senate on 16 June to investigate how it can be afforded but in effect this did not happen. Again, we will continue lobbying him on your behalf.

Labor remain opposed to Fair Indexation, although some recent comments " .. they have a fair claim .. " offer us some hope.

WHY WE SUPPORTED A LIMITED BILL

The Fair Indexation Bill would have provided Fair Indexation only to those DFRDB / DFRB recipients aged 55 and over. Our position has always been that Fair Indexation must be provided to ALL military superannuants and we will continue to lobby for that. The Bill, if passed, would have been a welcome first step, but was exactly that – a first step. Had it passed, our battle would then have focussed on extending it more widely.

WHAT YOU SHOULD DO

The involvement of individuals is fundamental to the campaign and cannot be stressed enough. Elected representatives need to hear from their constituents and we ask your help keeping up the pressure with direct letters, emails and face-to-face meetings with LABOR, the GREENS and INDEPENDENT Members of Parliament and Senators.

The support for Fair Indexation by the LIBERAL / NATIONAL Coalition is well documented and public, and any approach to them ought to be one of thanks for supporting the concept of Fair Indexation; thanks for pursuing it into the Senate; and reminding them of their commitment to progress it into the next election and beyond.

WHAT WE WILL DO

DFWA and its partners will not be deterred and will continue its hard work into the next phase of the Fair Go! Campaign. See our website for further information as to how you can be involved

FINALLY DO NOT DESPAIR - WE HAVE ACHIEVED A LOT SO FAR!

Since embarking on this campaign we have had the matter debated in the Senate; we have released robust data to support our claims; all MPs and Senators are well aware of the issue; and the Opposition has a firm policy of support in place.

SO WE MUST NOT LESSEN OUR RESOLVE AND LET THESE RECENT SUCCESSES PASS US BY BECAUSE OF THE FAILURE OF THE FAIR INDEXATION BILL.

House Insurance

House insurance is a BBQ topic of late in Queensland and I got a surprise with the cost of the premium on my abode last month. The premium has increased by almost 50% over the last couple of years. First thought was of floods and cyclones pushing up the premiums of all insurance companies, but a close check of the bill showed some significant causes for alarm. First, the sum insured for the house was at least 30% more than rebuilding the same house in the same suburb. Secondly, the contents sum insured had more than doubled! The reason? Some insurance companies index (now there is a familiar word) the sum insured upwards each year (obviously not at CPI rates) and my insurance company is obviously mathematically generous. Next, a call to that TV-advertised insurance company that asks all the questions and, after a myriad of questions, they gave me a substantially reduced quote. The good bit was when I went back to the original company with the reduced, and now accurate sum insured, they also quoted a premium much closer to reality, but, when I mentioned whom I had been talking to, they knocked another \$100 off without a murmur. Premium now close to what it was five years ago.
